Senator Betty Little continued her support of libraries through a just under \$1000 per library grant, administered by the Clinton, Essex, Franklin Library System, which resulted in the purchase of some much-desired additions to the collection including recent juvenile and adult fiction and non-fiction books; audio books and DVD releases.

We have been awarded a \$450 grant from the Lake Placid Education Foundation to purchase e-readers.

Board member Alison Haas turned to family and friends for permile or flat pledges for her "Running for Reading" Burlington marathon, raising over \$1,000 for the library.
